Rules or relationship?

The Church gives us some pretty specific guidance on how to live out our sexuality, but if we look at them as just a list of “do’s” and “don’ts” or burdensome rules, we miss out on the whole meaning behind them, and risk being like the “Rich Young Man” in this weekend’s Gospel.

The Church’s teachings on sexuality are meant to guide us into a deeper relationship with our spouse, just as the commandments were meant to guide the “Rich Young Man” into a deeper relationship with God.

We can do this by:

- Admitting they are difficult and asking God for the grace of courage to live them out.
- Seeking clear teaching on “why” the Church teaches what she does before rejecting them.
- Ask a trusted friend or priest to help you understand the teachings you struggle with the most.
