

A message from Father Quentin ...

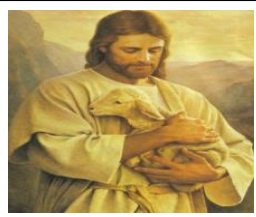
*"I give thanks to my God
