A place to pray for the souls of the deceased, even if you have no one buried there. Cemeteries are a wonderful blessing for those still living. 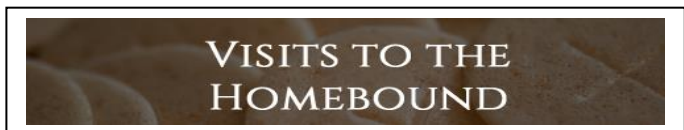
