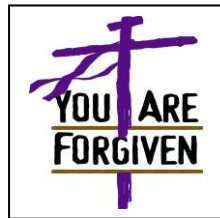
3rd Pillar of Lent is Almsgiving

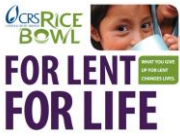
