Faith Minute....



In the Gospel, we hear that the disciples “worshiped, but they doubted.” Jesus appeared to them *after rising from the dead*, and they still aren’t 100% convinced. What more could he possibly do? Well, he has a plan. He will send the Holy Spirit to clothe them “with power from on high.” This Spirit will take the outward evidence they have seen and put it into their hearts, so not only will their own doubts be gone, but they will be able to witness to others. That same Spirit comes upon us at Pentecost!

To prepare for Pentecost, offer Jesus the following:

- Reoccurring conflicts with your spouse or family members that make you feel “stuck”
 - Frustrating things about your spouse or family members that you don’t understand
 - Any disappointment or doubt that you are dealing with
- And then pray for the Holy Spirit to move in your life and those around you.
- Pray that forgiveness, understanding and healing can be fostered and love and joy can grow more abundantly!
