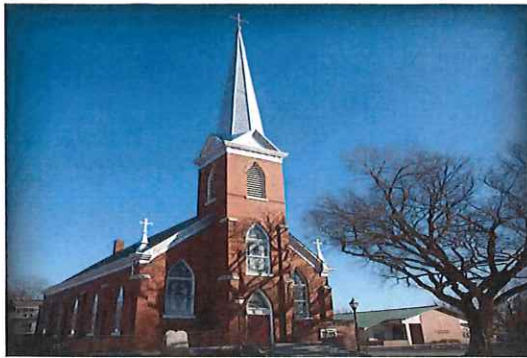
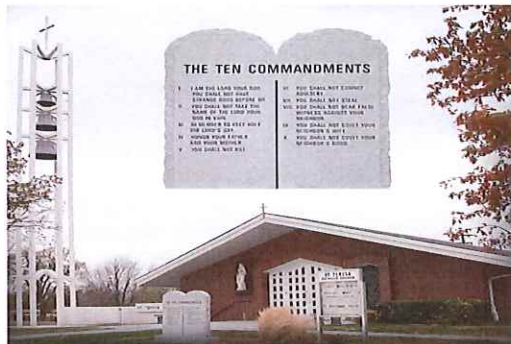

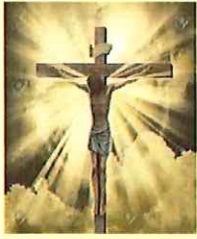

What is the Exaltation of the Holy Cross?

The Feast of the Exaltation of the Cross is a Catholic celebration on September 14 that commemorates the three events that surround the Cross of Christ.

First, is the discovery of the True Cross upon which Jesus was crucified. The Cross was found in the 4th century by St. Helena in approximately 320 AD.

Second, is the dedication of churches that Constantine had constructed in 335 AD on the sites of the Holy Sepulchre and Mount Calvary in Jerusalem where Jesus' crucifixion and burial took place.

Third, the recovery of the True Cross from the Persians in 628 by Emperor Heraclius. The True Cross was brought back to Jerusalem in 625.

During the original event, the Patriarch lifted the True Cross for the people to see and adore, a gesture that became the basis for the feast. Christians show reverence for the cross through kneeling, bowing, and singing, expressions of respect for Christ's Sacrifice.

Today, as Catholic Christians, the celebration of the feast day is an exaltation of the cross as the universal instrument of Christ's saving sacrifice, the symbol of his victory over death, and the source of hope and redemption for believers. The feast is a profound expression of faith, gratitude, and reverence for the cross as the central symbol of Christianity. To "exalt" means to "lift up" or to raise to a high status. The feast exalts the cross, transforming it from a barbaric instrument of torture into the "tree of victory" and the "tree of life" through Christ's redemptive work.

We are called everyday, but especially during the feast, to remember the "crosses" we must bear as Christians. We must carry our crosses, transforming life's difficulties into opportunities to participate in Christ's suffering and sacrifice. We need to focus on God's great love and mercy, which is revealed through the cross and finally, we must turn away from sin and toward a relationship with God. Redemptive suffering is a Christian concept where personal struggles are united with Christ's suffering on the cross to participate in the work of salvation and bring meaning to pain. Christ's voluntary crucifixion was an act of love for humanity, taking on the weight of sin and death. By embracing our own "crosses"— illnesses, adversities, and suffering — we have the opportunity to unite them to Christ's sacrifice. Through the remembrance of this feast day, we can find a deeper purpose in not only our pain but we can even contribute to the redemption of others.

Today and everyday we are called to exalt high His Holy Cross and witness to His loving gift of salvation.

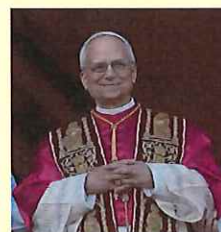

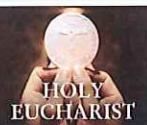

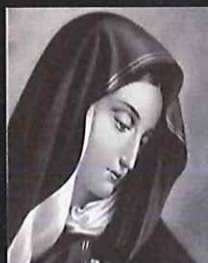
