Holy Week and the Church's Customs of the Triduum

Palm Sunday

- On Palm Sunday the Church celebrates the triumphant entry of Jesus into Jerusalem. Jerusalem was the city of King David. Jesus entering the city as a king would have been a clear indication to the Jews and the Romans alike that Jesus was claiming power. What they missed was that the power Jesus was laying claim to was not worldly but spiritual in nature.
- We commemorate this day by blessing palms, which the faithful would have waved as Christ entered Jerusalem, and by then processing into the Church. We also read the Passion Narrative which took place during Holy Week

Monday of Holy Week

- The Church traditionally remembers Jesus' Cleansing of the Temple on Monday of Holy Week. This is when Jesus drove away those selling items used for worship at exorbitant prices and the money changers who were making money off of peoples coming a long distance to do their religious duty.
- A tradition that has built up around Holy Week is to do a deep cleaning of one's home. This helps us symbolically clean ourselves for receiving Jesus at Easter, but it also prepares our home for family coming for Easter Dinner!

Tuesday of Holy Week

- Tuesday of Holy is associated with the plot against Jesus. This is the day when the Pharisees started seriously planning their actions against Jesus, and when they first approached Judas about betraying Him.

Wednesday of Holy Week

- On Wednesday of Holy Week Jesus went to Bethany, which is 2 miles outside of Jerusalem (where his friends Mary, Martha, and Lazarus lived). Here he rested for a day before entering into his 3 day Passion for the Salvation of the World.

Holy Thursday (Maundy Thursday)

- The Chrism Mass is traditionally held on the morning of Holy Thursday. At the Chrism Mass priests renew their priestly promises. Additionally at this Mass the bishop blesses the three Holy Oils used in the Church throughout the year. The Oil of Catechumens is used in the Rite of Baptism. The Oil of the Sick is used during the sacrament of Anointing of the Sick. Sacred Chrism, which is a mixture of olive oil and myrrh, is used for the most important things in the Church. Sacred Chrism is used when the bishop consecrates a new altar on which the Eucharist will be celebrated, during the Rite of Ordination to consecrate a priest's hands, and during the Rite of Confirmation and the Rite of Baptism on the head of the one to be baptized. The Chrism Mass has traditionally been celebrated on the morning of Holy Thursday because Jesus was anointed with "a costly perfumed oil" by Mary Magdalene while staying in Bethany on Thursday morning before heading to Jerusalem to celebrate the Passover with his Apostles in the evening. Due to many dioceses being spread out and the importance of priests needing to attend this Mass the Church gives permission for the Chrism Mass to be celebrated on another day in Holy Week, in our Archdiocese we celebrate the Chrism Mass on Tuesday.
- On the evening of Holy Thursday the Church celebrates the Mass of the Lord's Supper. This Mass is commemorating Jesus' celebration of the Passover meal with His Apostles during which he instituted both the Eucharist and Priesthood. The Holy Thursday Mass is a brief moment of celebration between the season of Lent (which ends at the start of this Mass) and the sorrow of Good Friday. At this Mass we sing the Gloria with bells ringing, after the bells finish ringing during the Gloria they are not to be rung again until the Gloria is sung at the Easter Vigil. At the conclusion of the Mass the altar is stripped and Mass is not to be said again until the Easter Vigil. Many Churches will have a period of adoration following the Mass to commemorate Jesus' Agony in the Garden of Gethsemane before his arrest later in the evening.

Good Friday

- On Good Friday Mass is not said. Instead, the Church recalls the suffering of Jesus by reading the Passion Narrative and Venerating the the Cross, often by kissing or touching a crucifix. The priest will remove his chasuble and shoes during the veneration of the Cross showing that he is not acting in the person of Christ like he would during most parts of a liturgical celebration but is coming before the Cross as a humble sinner himself in need of redemption.
- To help us join in the Passion of Christ, Good Friday is a day of fasting and abstinence. This means no meat on Good Friday and those who are bound by rules of fasting are required to fast. (Those under 14, 60 or older, those pregnant, or sick are all exempt from fasting.)

Holy Saturday

- During the day of Holy Saturday the only Sacraments that are allowed to take place are Anointing of the Sick and Confession. There is no Mass, and Communion is not to be distributed on this day. Only in imminent danger of death is it allowed to receive Baptism, Confirmation, and the Eucharist on this day. We are called to remember the desolation of Jesus in the Tomb this day in preparation for the great joy that is celebrated at Easter.

Easter Vigil - Easter Sunday

- The Church celebrates the Easter Vigil after sundown on Holy Saturday (for the Jews this would have started Sunday, their days started at sundown). The Easter Vigil must be finished before sunrise on Easter Sunday. Traditionally this Mass would have been celebrated in the very early hours of the morning often starting around 3am and ending just prior to sunrise. This Mass is meant to start in darkness to show us that Christ is the true light of the world. On this day we celebrate the great joy of the Resurrection of Jesus from the Dead. This celebration lasts for eight days of solemnity, called the Octave of Easter which lasts through the Second Sunday of Easter. The celebration of Easter then continues in a less solemn way through the celebration of Pentecost 50 days later.

1st Holy Eucharist will be celebrated on Divine Mercy weekend (April 11 & 12) for all parishes. Please pray for the 1st Communion students to feel the Holy Spirit move in their lives.

The office will be closed April 1 - April 6 and there will be No CCD classes held at any parish Easter weekend. God bless you all!
